HYC Junior Sailing Program Equipment Policy

Lost or Damaged Boats, Parts and Equipment

Each sailor is responsible for making sure his/her boat is well maintained. Boats will be checked in the morning and at the end of the sailing class day by an Instructor. Sailors must report any loss or damage immediately to his/her Instructor. If, through carelessness and/or irresponsible action, boats and equipment are damaged or lost, the sailor and his/her parents will be held accountable.

In the event of such an incident, the Instructor concerned will make out a written report. The Head Instructor will phone the parent to report the incident. The head instructor will then add to the Instructor's report an estimate of the cost of repair or replacement required and will forward a copy of both these reports to the Club Manager. The Manager will mail a copy to the parent and charge the cost to the member's account.

I agree to abide by the Equipment Policy and accept financial responsibility for my child's participation in the HYC Junior Sailing Program.
